Page 6, after line 13, insert the following:

1	(c) GAO STUDY.—The Comptroller General of the
2	United States shall conduct a study to examine and deter-
3	mine the following:
4	(1) The best available point-in-time and longitu-
5	dinal estimates available of the number of individ-
6	uals and families nationwide who are homeless—
7	(A) as such term is defined in section
8	103(a) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless As-
9	sistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11302(a)), as in effect
10	immediately before the enactment of this Act;
11	(B) as such term is defined in paragraphs
12	(1) through (4) of section 103(a) of such Act,
13	as amended by this section; and
14	(C) as such term is defined in section
15	103(a)(5) of such Act, as amended by this sec-
16	tion (relating to imminent loss of housing); and
17	(D) as such term is defined in other provi-
18	sions of Federal law

1	(2) The best estimates available of the overlap
2	among the populations included in the estimates
3	under subparagraphs (A) through (D) of paragraph
4	(1).
5	(3) The quality of the data underlying the each
6	of the estimates under subparagraphs (A) through
7	(D) of paragraph (1).
8	(4) The cost and feasibility of conducting high-
9	quality nationwide point-in-time counts, and longitu-
10	dinal counts over a duration of more than one year,
11	of homeless individuals and families under each of
12	the definitions of homelessness referred to in sub-
13	paragraphs (A) through (D) of paragraph (1).
14	(5) The best available longitudinal data, cov-
15	ering a minimum of six months, on the residential
16	movement of individuals and families who are home-
17	less under the definitions referred to in paragraph
18	(1)(D), but not under the definitions referred to in
19	paragraph (1)(A) or (1)(B), into circumstances that
20	meet the definition of homelessness under paragraph
21	(1)(A)  or  (1)(B).
22	(6) The best available data to enable prediction
23	of whether an individual or family that is homeless
24	under the definitions referred to in paragraph
25	(1)(D), but not under the definition referred to in

1	paragraph (1)(A) or (1)(B), will within the next 12
2	months meet the definition of homelessness under
3	paragraph $(1)(A)$ or $(1)(B)$ .
4	(7) The best available research on the effective-
5	ness of activities eligible for funding under this title
6	IV of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act
7	at improving the housing conditions of households
8	described in paragraph (1)(D), but not in subpara-
9	graphs (A) through (C) of paragraph (1).
10	(8) The best available data on the childhood
11	housing, child welfare, and other experiences of
12	adults who are currently homeless, including individ-
13	uals or heads of household who are chronically
14	homeless, to determine whether homelessness as a
15	child, as defined under subparagraphs (A) through
16	(D) of paragraph (1), or other traumatic childhood
17	experiences, including sexual abuse, predict an in-
18	creased likelihood of adult homelessness;
19	(9) The extent to which the definitions of home-
20	less set forth in provisions of Federal law other than
21	section 103 of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assist-
22	ance Act fulfill the purposes of the programs author-
23	ized by those provisions.
24	Not later than the expiration of the 12-month period be-
25	ginning upon the date of the enactment of this Act, the

- 4 effect on the date of the enactment of this Act.

Page 10, line 17, strike "paragraph" and insert "paragraphs".

Page 10, line 24, strike the first period, the closing quotation marks, and the last period, and insert "; and".

Page 10, after line 24, insert the following:

5 "(15) not later than the expiration of the 6-6 month period beginning upon completion of the 7 study required under section 3(c) of the Homeless 8 Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to 9 Housing Act of 2008, convene a meeting of rep-10 resentatives of all Federal agencies and committees 11 of the House of Representatives and the Senate hav-12 ing jurisdiction over any Federal program to assist 13 homeless individuals or families, local and State gov-14 ernments, academic researchers who specialize in 15 homelessness, nonprofit housing and service pro-16 viders that receive funding under any Federal pro-17 gram to assist homeless individuals or families, orga-

1	nizations advocating on behalf of such nonprofit pro-
2	viders and homeless persons receiving housing or
3	services under any such Federal program, and home-
4	less persons receiving housing or services under any
5	such Federal program, at which meeting such rep-
6	resentatives shall discuss all issues relevant to
7	whether the definitions of 'homeless' under para-
8	graphs (1) through (4) of section 103(a) of the
9	McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, as
10	amended by section 3 of the Homeless Emergency
11	Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing Act of
12	2008, should be modified by the Congress, including
13	whether there is a compelling need for a uniform
14	definition of homelessness under Federal law, the ex-
15	tent to which the differences in such definitions cre-
16	ate barriers for individuals to accessing services and
17	to collaboration between agencies, and the relative
18	availability, and barriers to access of persons defined
19	as homeless, of mainstream programs identified by
20	the Government Accountability Office in the two re-
21	ports identified in paragraph (7) of this subsection;
22	and shall submit transcripts of such meeting, and
23	any majority and dissenting recommendations from
24	such meetings, to each committee of the House of
25	Representatives and the Senate having jurisdiction

over any Federal program to assist homeless individuals or families not later than the expiration of the 60-day period beginning upon conclusion of such meeting.".
