BUDGET WATCH: WILL THE DOMESTIC 23 CAVE, OR WILL THEY STAND BY THEIR WORD?

The following 23 House Republicans sent a letter to Speaker Hastert on March 15, 2006 expressing their "strong reservations" about "voting for any budget that would result in real cuts to a number of programs" like education, health care, housing, veterans' services, and key urban support programs. According to these Members, the failure to include a minimum of a 2 percent increase in non-security discretionary programs "could make it difficult for members to support individual appropriations bills as they move forward."
