

Investing in medical and scientific research is an essential function of the federal government. I apply rigorous standards of fiscal responsibility to every spending request I receive. My starting answer is always "no" .... and a "yes" is very hard to earn. Here are several important projects for Houston medical institutions that I was proud to win funding for:

- \$12.9 million total for the Alliance for NanoHealth.
- \$860,000 for the Harris County Hospital District for the renovation and expansion of Ben Taub's emergency room.
- \$750,000 for Methodist Hospital to purchase two linear accelerators (used to treat cancer patients) lost in Tropical Storm Allison.
- \$750,000 for Baylor College of Medicine for renovation of the comprehensive cancer center damaged in Tropical Storm Allison.
- \$700,000 for Texas Children's Hospital to expand their pediatric cardiovascular operation room.
- \$365,000 for the Methodist Hospital to purchase a mass spectrometer for cancer and health research.
- \$365,000 to Rice University for the Collaborative Research Center, which will allow researchers and doctors at the Texas Medical Center to work together to find ground-breaking solutions to today's health care problems.
- \$243,000 for the Harris County Hospital District for 16 cardiac monitors with a centralized monitoring unit, allowing LBJ Hospital to meet the current demands for better quality care.
- \$195,000 for The Institute for Research and Rehabilitation for the purchase of urodynamics equipment and microbiology and laboratory software.
- \$195,000 for the Memorial Hermann Health System for construction and equipment to build neighborhood health care centers.
