



## **Bills Signed into Law** **March 2005**

**Total number of bills and resolutions signed into law in March 2005: 4**

### **S. 686**

*Public Law 109-3*

A bill to provide for the relief of the parents of Theresa Marie Schiavo

Signed into law: March 21, 2005

Cost: No significant cost to taxpayers

---

### **H.R. 1160**

*Public Law 109-4*

To reauthorize the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families block grant program through June 30, 2005

Signed into law: March 25, 2005

Cost: Increases mandatory spending by \$239.0 million over five years

**S. 384**

*Public Law 109-5*

To extend the Nazi War Crimes and Japanese Imperial Government Records Interagency Working Group for 2 years

Signed into law: March 25, 2005

Cost: Authorizes \$4.0 million over five years

**H.R. 1270**

*Public Law 109-6*

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to extend the Leaking Underground Storage Tank Trust Fund financing rate

Signed into law: March 31, 2005

Cost: No significant budgetary effect
