Policy Brief..... FY 2004 Commerce, Justice, State Appropriations

BY THE NUMBERS:

The Committee bill is \$700 million or 1.9% above last year and \$237 million or 0.6% above the request.

PROGRAM TERMINATIONS:

- Advanced Technology Program (ATP) The Committee eliminates funding for the program. Last year the program was funded at \$180 million.
- East-West Center The Committee eliminated the direct funding for the Center. Last year the Center received \$17.9 million.

LANGUAGE OF NOTE:

- UNESCO: The bill includes \$71.4 million for the U.S. to rejoin UNESCO.
- <u>Religious and Moral Protection:</u> The bill continues prior-year language prohibiting any DOJ funds from being used to discriminate or denigrate moral or religious beliefs.
- <u>FCC Media Ownership.</u> The bill includes a provision to prohibit funds in the bill to grant licenses for a commercial TV broadcast station if the granting of that license would result in such party having an aggregate national audience reach exceeding 35 percent. This would override the FCC's recent decision.
- <u>Amendments Related to Gun Owners:</u> The bill includes several new provisions added by Rep. Tiahrt which, according to proponents, would among other things:
 - <u>Prevent release of confidential law enforcement data</u>-such as multiple handgun sales reports and unredacted firearm trace data. This information had <u>never</u> been

- released until a court decision last year after lawyers took BATFE to court on a fishing expedition to gather evidence for lawsuits against the firearms industry.
- Prevent BATFE from building a gun registration database through demands for records that have always been retained only by dealers. Dealers would still have to comply with all trace requests sent to them by BATFE in the course of a legitimate criminal investigation, and any refusal could still be punished either as a criminal offense or by revocation of a dealer's license.
- Require immediate destruction of instant check records-as required by the Brady Act when it was passed in 1993.
- Restore a longstanding compromise on the "relief from disabilities" program. Individuals (such as convicted felons) who are prohibited from gun ownership would still be blocked from even asking for restoration of rights. The language would continue to allow corporations to apply for relief-so that the Attorney General would have full discretion to let a business stay open under new management when doing so would not jeopardize public safety.
- <u>Clarify firearms licensing requirements</u>. The language ensures that BATFE looks only at legitimate criteria in issuing dealers' licenses.
- <u>Inventory.</u> The language would prevent BATFE from finalizing a Clinton administration proposed rule that would require an intrusive and expensive complete physical inventory each year-which is not a normal business practice and is very burdensome for small businesses.
- <u>Disclaimer on BATF Statistics</u>. The amendment would put a disclaimer on BATFE trace studies, noting that firearms traces are performed to solve crimes, not as an academic exercise.

EARMARKS:

The Committee Report directs the Office of Justice Programs to report to Congress on whether or not it will fund over 100 separate projects (See Pages 41 through 45 of the Committee Report).

The Committee Report directs the COPS program to report to Congress on whether or not it will fund over 100 separate projects (See Pages 48 through 52 of the Committee Report).

The Committee Report directs the Office of Justice Programs to report to Congress on whether or not it will fund a nearly four-page long list of projects (See Pages 56 through 60 of the Committee Report).

FUNDING SUMMARIES & PERFORMANCE EVALUATION:

Special Note: As part of his FY 2004 Budget, the President included for the first time performance and management assessments for some federal programs. Programs evaluated were placed into one of five categories: effective, moderately effective, adequate, ineffective, or results not demonstrated (if inadequate data was available). For those programs assessed by the Administration and funded in this bill, the RSC has included the relevant evaluation. If a program is left blank, there was no evaluation included in the President's Budget.
