Last Friday, Congress adjourned and left Washington for five weeks. Unfortunately, the Democrat leadership did not schedule energy votes to bring desperately-needed relief to American families.

After Speaker Pelosi adjourned the House, I took to the floor with my Republican colleagues to voice my displeasure. Republican Leader John Boehner, Minority Whip Roy Blunt and a number of others stayed on the floor demanding a vote on drilling here and drilling now. Speaker Pelosi literally turned off the lights, the cameras and the microphones, but we stayed down there in the dark demanding action to open up domestic sources of oil and gas. It is my hope that our words in the dark will shine light on their inaction.

It is deeply frustrating that we left for recess without taking action to deal with our nation's energy crisis. Developing our own energy supply is critical to becoming energy independent. I have signed <u>7 discharge petitions</u> to bring energy development legislation to the floor; however, the Democrat Leadership has stopped all efforts to drill here and drill now and decided to go on 5 week recess without holding a single substantive vote to reduce the price at the pump.

When Congress comes back in September, we will have much work to do. On October 1 - American Energy Freedom Day - the current prohibitions on oil and gas leasing on most of the Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) and on oil shale leasing on federal lands will expire, unless Congress acts to extend them. I have joined my Republican colleagues and signed onto 2 letters urging the Democrat Leadership to allow these prohibitions to expire as scheduled under current law, and will vigorously oppose any attempt to extend them.

I will also continue providing our border sheriffs and law enforcement officers with the resources they need to restore law and order.
