# If you want to switch your Medicare Prescription Drug Plan you must do so between **Nov. 15** and **Dec. 31**.

As a doctor, I encourage every senior to review their prescription coverage every year. If you find another plan will better serve you, be sure to switch before December 31st. If you have any questions about your Prescription Drug Plan, call your primary healthcare provider or contact Medicare directly at 1-800-MEDICARE. It is important for Southwest Louisiana seniors to have the proper coverage they need.

### If you have a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan

If you are one of the millions of seniors who has signed up for a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan, now is your opportunity to review your current plan and see if it is still the best option for you.

Medicare recipients can switch their Prescription Drug Plans from November 15 to December 31. If you do not switch by December 31, you will need to wait until November, 2008 to switch plans. (You do not need to do anything to remain in your current plan.)

Millions of seniors have taken advantage of the Medicare Prescription Drug Plan to cut the amount they pay out of pocket for their medicines. But plans change every year, and you could now save more with a different plan. November 15 to December 31 is the only period when you may switch Drug Plans.

That's why Congressman Boustany is providing you with the **Prescription Work Sheet** on the back of this update. Simply fill it out and take it to your physician in order to determine which Drug Plan will work best for you. # If you have not already signed up for a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan, you can join three months before you turn 65 to three months after you turn 65 (called your Initial Enrollment Period.)


