Veterans: A Historic Increase in Veterans Funding

On Thursday, I helped pass a major spending increase for the care of our nation's veterans through the Senate. The bill includes \$3.6 billion more than President Bush has called for and is \$10 billion more than what was allotted for veterans last year. This historic increase comes at a time when those who have served us are facing difficulties getting the benefits and care they have earned. Among other things, the bill will help to reduce long benefits waiting lines, produce better prosthetics, and will expand access to desperately needed mental health care.

<u>Food and Workplace Safety</u>: Protecting Workers and Consumers from Chemical Used in Artificial Flavoring

On Friday, I joined with Senator Edward Kennedy in sending letters to the Centers for Disease Control, the Food and Drug Administration, and the Department of Labor that outlined our concerns with the risks of diacetyl, a chemical found in artificial flavorings. Diacetyl is commonly used in the artificial butter flavoring found in microwave popcorn. Workers in some factories that produce artificial butter flavoring have been diagnosed with a very serious lung condition.
