#### Army Suicides: Suicides Continue to Rise as Stress and Strain on Soldiers Continues

Last week, distressing numbers were revealed in an internal Army report that showed that Army suicides rose by nearly 20 percent last year. The statistics revealed that 121 Army soldiers had taken their lives and that many more had attempted suicide. On Thursday, <u>I wrote to Secretary of Defense Robert Gates</u>, whom I have talked to on this subject before, to see what more can be done to stem the tide of this frightening trend. I am deeply troubled that the stress and strain of long and repeated deployments is taking to great a toll on our brave men and women. - <u>Details</u>

### Northern Border: We Need a More Secure System that Doesn't Hurt Businesses and Communities

Last week, in defiance of many in Congress, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) began instituting new identification requirements along the northern border. The new requirements disallow the use of stateissued licenses without also producing a passport or birth certificate. Birth certificates, as DHS Secretary Michael Chertoff has acknowledged in the past, come in many forms and are susceptible to forgery. <u>I wrote</u> to Secretary Chertoff along with a bi-partisan group of northern border Senators to urge him to suspend the new requirements until a secure system that takes into account the needs of our northern border businesses and communities can be instituted. On Thursday, DHS acknowledged that there will be an unspecified grace period for travelers without the proper documents. - <u>Details</u>
