Great News for Veterans Statewide

Yesterday, I got a series of new commitments from VA Secretary Jim Nicholson to help Washington's veterans.

Walla Walla WILL Have a Formal Role in VA Plans

The Secretary gave me his commitment that the Walla Walla community will have a direct and official role in determining the future of the Wainwright campus. Specifically, he agreed to send his proposal to the Local Advisory Panel. I appreciate his commitment, and I'm going to hold him to it.

I'm also pleased that he's agreed to sit down with me so we can talk about what services will be provided at the new facility. I made it clear that mental healthcare, rehab and nursing home care are not adequately available in communities around Walla Walla, and we need to see how he'll provide that care to veterans under his proposal. New Clinic in Northwest Washington

During a campaign stop in Bellingham two weeks ago, Secretary Nicholson announced a new clinic to serve veterans in Northwest Washington. But since then, I've been able to get very few details from the VA. Yesterday, I pressed the Secretary and got some clear answers. He confirmed that a new clinic would be opened to serve veterans in Northwest Washington. He said that a location has not been chosen, but it would be somewhere between Seattle and the Canadian border. He said they plan to pick a location before the end of the year and that it would then open about six months later.

In a separate move this week, I added language to a bill that calls on the VA to move forward with new clinics in Northwest Washington and Centralia.

Funding to Replace VA Nursing Home in Puget Sound

Currently, 70 veterans at the VA nursing home at American Lake (Tacoma) are housed in an earthquake-damaged building that could collapse if there's another earthquake. That's why this week I worked to secure \$38 million to build a new VA nursing home and Alzheimer's ward in Tacoma. I got the funding, but there is a big hurdle over approval that will need to be resolved before we can build the safe, modern facility our veterans deserve.

Veterans Healthcare Funding – UP 12 Percent

This week a Senate committee approved a bill I've been working on to increase funding veterans healthcare by 12 percent. Next the bill must be passed on the Senate floor.
