On Monday, I introduced the *Dextromethorphan Distribution Act* in the U.S. Senate. The bill would make it illegal for any unregistered individual to possess or distribute unfinished Dextromethorphan (DXM). DXM is the safe and effective active ingredient found in many over-the-counter cough and cold medicines, but it is also being increasingly abused by teenagers in its unfinished form. DXM has been blamed in the deaths of several youths across the country, including two Bellingham, WA teens who purchased DXM over the internet in 2005. - More

On Thursday, I joined with Senators Kit Bond (R-MO), and John Rockefeller (D-WV) to call on the Departments of Veterans Affairs (VA) and Defense (DoD) to notify and care for Gulf War veterans who may have been exposed to dangerous sarin nerve gas in 1991. Two new DoD and VA funded research studies show a "significant association" between Gulf War illnesses and exposure to sarin.
