Iraq: Speaking Out to Give Our Troops More Time at Home

On Wednesday (9/19), I spoke on the Senate floor in favor of a bi-partisan amendment that would have provided service members with more time at home with their families, increased our military readiness, and improved our ability to respond to disasters at home. The amendment would have given active duty service members at least as much time at home as they spend deployed. It would have also provided National Guard and Reserve troops the time off they need to be with their families and respond to emergencies here at home. Unfortunately, the amendment, which needed 60 votes to move forward, was narrowly defeated by Senate Republicans 56-44.
