Northern Border: Helping Protect the Border with Canada

Veterans: Expanding Benefits for National Guard and Reserve Vets

On Monday (10/01), I helped pass an amendment to the 2008 Defense Authorization bill that would expand a program that fast tracks veterans' disability benefits to include National Guard and Reserve members. The amendment calls for the Secretary of Defense and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to present a plan to expand the successful Benefits Delivery Discharge (BDD) program to National Guard and Reserve members. - <u>Details</u>
