# **Preserving Jobs and History**

# **Hanford B-Reactor**

On Thursday (11/29), I toured the Hanford Nuclear site and spoke out about the need to preserve the B-Reactor facility as a monument to our nation's history and the sacrifices of the local community. The B-Reactor was the first large scale plutonium production reactor ever built, and was a critical part of the Manhattan Project. While at Hanford, I also met with Department of Energy site managers, received briefings from contractors, and discussed national security programs currently underway at the Pacific Northwest National laboratory (PNNL).

#### PNNL "Use Permit"

While in the Tri-Cities, I held a bi-partisan press conference with congressman Doc Hastings to reiterate our support for PNNL's "Use Permit" that allows PNNL researchers to do critical private work using the PNNL labs at Hanford. The "Use-Permit" creates hundreds of jobs at PNNL and is vital to the economy of the area.
