Last week, the President and leaders in the House of Representatives agreed on the framework of a plan to stimulate our sagging economy that centers on providing rebates for taxpayers. I believe that putting money back in the pockets of working families is a good first step on a long road to economic recovery. I also believe that in order to help get more families back on their feet, we need to invest more here at home – in our housing, our roads and in creating jobs. In the coming days, I will be working to include additional components in the stimulus package that will support seniors, provide assistance with lighting and heating costs, and help those on food stamps.
