Women Veterans: Preparing the VA for New Needs of Women Veterans

Last week, I discussed my bill to prepare the VA for the influx of women veterans set to utilize VA services during a hearing of the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee. My bill authorizes programs to improve care for Military Sexual Trauma (MST), increase research on the current barriers to care, expand women veterans staff positions, establish a pilot program to reimburse child care services for qualified veterans, and improve counseling services. It is projected that the number of female veterans who use the VA system will double in the next five years, making female veterans one of the fastest growing subgroups of veterans. - Details
