Last Thursday (6/26), my legislation to improve care for women veterans at the Department of Veterans' Affairs (VA) passed the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee. The legislation addresses many of the unique needs of female veterans by authorizing programs to improve care for Military Sexual Trauma (MST), increase research on the current barriers to care, and expand women veterans staff positions at the VA.

Tankers: Time for the Air Force to Conduct a Truly Fair Bidding Process

Last Thursday (6/26), I delivered a speech on the Senate floor after the Government Accountability Office (GAO) issued a scathing decision that found that the Air Force's decision to award a contract for aerial refueling tankers was riddled with problems. The GAO decision found that the Air Force significantly overestimated the cost of Boeing's tanker, misled Boeing, and that the Air Force selected Airbus even though the company failed to meet key requirements of the contract. In my speech I called on the Air Force to follow the recommendations the GAO of and re-bid the contract.
