Schumer**, Chairman of the Joint Economic Committee (JEC), will hold a hearing on the United States' economic outlook with Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, Ben Bernanke **on November 8, 2007 at 10:00 am** in **Room 216 of the Hart Senate Office Building**. As the subprime mortgage market fallout spills over into the broader housing market, trade deficits rise, and the dollar weakens, Sen.
