Dear Chairman Miller, Chairman Kennedy, Ranking Member McKeon and Ranking Member Enzi:

On behalf of the New York State Board of Regents, I want to thank you for including in the Higher Education Act conference report an expansion of eligibility under current federal loan forgiveness programs to teachers in educational service agencies (ESAs). Leveling the playing field for teachers, whether they are employed in a "school" or in an "ESA," will help to ensure that wherever students learn, they will be taught by highly qualified and highly effective teachers.

While the new expansion will benefit states from coast to coast, it will be particularly helpful in New York where the majority of classes in our ESAs, or BOCES, are for students with disabilities and students enrolled in career and technical education classes – two areas where New York is experiencing teacher shortages.

We appreciate your attention to this critical issue and look forward to the loan forgiveness provisions becoming law.
