IMPORTANT.—March 14, 1925.—Prior editions of this pamphlet contained figures received direct from the several State authorities showing the popular vote for presidential electors, which, upon comparison with the figures reported in the certificates of such vote transmitted by the governors of each State to the Secretary of State of the United States, pursuant to act of Congress of February 3, 1887, and by him transmitted to Congress, revealed discrepancies which, in this, the final edition, have been reconciled and the grand totals corrected accordingly.
