Veterans Affairs to Open Clinic in Wexford

The Department of Veterans Affairs has announced that it intends to establish an outpatient clinic in Wexford County, which is expected to open in 2010.

The Community-Based Outpatient Clinic is designed to improve access for high-priority enrolled veterans in rural areas to primary and specialty care. It will be located in an area that will greatly reduce driving time, and is expected to serve 1,800 patients in its first year. It will employ six full-time employees. Services will include primary care and mental health services.

Hoekstra Condemns Potential CIA Cover-Up in Death of Bowers Family

U.S. Rep. Hoekstra, the top Republican on the House Intelligence Committee, strongly criticized rogue CIA employees after a CIA Inspector General report concluded that they had attempted to block congressional and federal investigations into the agency's role in a shoot-down of a plane carrying the Bowers family in Peru.

Hoekstra called for the House Intelligence Committee to hold hearings into the incident involving the Bowers and potential attempts by the CIA to obstruct previous congressional inquiries into the matter.
