H.R. 1995 Diabetes in Minority Populations Evaluation Act of 2010

As ordered reported by the House Committee on Energy and Commerce on September 23, 2010

H.R. 1995 would require the Secretary of Health and Human Services to submit a report to the Congress on the research and other public health activities of the department that are related to diabetes among minority populations. The report would include evaluations of diabetes research, diabetes surveillance and data collection, community-based interventions, and education and training of health professionals on diabetes prevention and management and its related complications. In addition, the report would include recommendations for improvement of the research and other public health activities of the department with respect to diabetes among minority populations.

CBO estimates that implementing H.R. 1995 would cost less than \$500,000, subject to the availability of appropriated funds. The costs of this legislation fall within budget function 550 (health). Enacting H.R. 1995 would not affect direct spending or revenues; therefore, pay-as-you-go procedures do not apply.

H.R. 1995 contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act and would impose no costs on state, local, or tribal governments.
