



## S & T Energy Legislation Signed into Law

On Dec. 18, 2007, the House passed the final version of H.R. 6, the *Energy Independence and Security Act*. This legislation includes numerous contributions from the Committee.

In celebration of the energy package's passage Representatives and Senators participated in an enrollment ceremony after the final House vote. Speaker Pelosi recognized **House Committee on Science and Technology Chairman Bart Gordon (D-TN)** for the Committee's contributions to the final energy legislation. The Committee contributed nine bills to the final package: H.R. 1933, H.R. 2229, H.R. 2304, H.R. 2313, H.R. 2773, H.R. 2774, H.R. 3775, H.R. 3776, H.R. 632.

On Dec. 19, 2007 the President signed H.R. 6 into law.

## President Signs Chairman Gordon's Meth Bill

On Dec. 21, 2007, the President signed H.R. 365, the *Methamphetamine Remediation Research Act of 2007* into law. Chairman Bart Gordon introduced this legislation in order to cease the negative aftermath of methamphetamine (meth) in communities.

H.R. 365 requires the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to develop a model for voluntary, health-based clean-up guidelines to make former meth labs safe and livable. In 2005, the Drug Enforcement Administration reported seizing about 12,500 meth labs nationwide.
