Project Description: Children's Services- The long-term impact of domestic violence on children in violent families is well-documented. Additionally, because risk of lethality increases after fleeing a violent relationship, safety planning for mothers and children becomes more critical. The project will support counseling services, including safety planning, for children from violent families.

Night/Weekend Coverage at Shelter- SWIC operates a 24 hour accessible shelter which requires continuous staffing. Overnight/evening/weekend staff are responsible for accepting victims into shelter, answering hotline calls, providing crisis counseling to residents, providing clerical assistance to victims petitioning for emergency protective orders through videoconferencing at the shelter site, and ensuring overall security. Project funds will help to ensure the availability of sufficient staff to perform these essential duties.

Community Education- As a result of declining resources SWIC has had to reduce community prevention/education efforts. As a result SWIC's ability to reach victims are hindered, but so are its ability to enlist supporters e.g. volunteers and donors. Reductions to this service inevitably result in a downward spiral.

Storage – In addition to its emergency shelter, SWIC operates 8 transitional housing units where homeless victims of domestic violence with children can reside for up to 2 years in a home setting. Each unit is furnished with good-quality donated items and survivors are free to take the items with them when they leave the program. However, SWIC must maintain a furniture bank to continue this service. Donated items are also available for non-resident survivors establishing new households to claim. As a result of shelter expansion the space previously designated for storage will shortly become a playroom for resident children.

Project Description: Harrisburg Area Community College's (HACC) Shumaker Public Safety Center (PSC) trains first responders and healthcare workers who risk their lives daily to aid those in danger. They are our society's true heroes. HACC's specialized instructors have shared their knowledge, skills, expertise nationally and internationally. The PSC is certified law enforcement training center under the Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission (MPOETC), ACT 120, and meets the growing need for education and training of municipal police officers. In 2010, PSC began its 11th part-

time Police Academy, allowing cadets to continue serving their communities part time while they attend school.

Family Group Conferencing (FGC) is a practice that identifies the expertise of extended family, both adult and peer friends, ministers, and all others who care about the well-being of a child. Utilizing that commitment and expertise, these individuals are brought together to design the care of the youth and the needs of the family. The safety of the community and restitution to the victim are also addressed. Both of these are critical for juveniles involved in delinquent acts.

Project Description: The Veterans Law Clinic was started in 1997 as a volunteer program to assist disabled veterans and military families with U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs compensation claims, related benefits, and to provide general legal counsel. The Initiative provides legal aid to veterans and military families that are living at 150% of poverty level or below and may that have a meritorious claim

under veterans' benefits. Additionally, the Clinic has expanded its services to provide wills, advanced health care directives, and powers of attorney for disabled veterans. These legal documents are essential to help veterans manage their health care and provide for their military families. With Widener University School of Law campuses in Harrisburg, the Veterans Law Clinic serves the traditionally high population of veterans in Pennsylvania. As the initiative has expanded its host of services, it will use additional funding to serve a greater number of veterans in the Harrisburg community as well the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the region.
