As it now stands, we will need to keep most of them for the next two – three years before we are able to get replacement vehicles on site.

Project Description: Harrisburg Intermodal Facility (HIMF) is located northwest of downtown Harrisburg in a two-mile long corridor adjacent to the NS main line and occupies approximately 50 acres. The Harrisburg IMF Expansion will not require any property acquisition, but will utilize available NS property more efficiently. The scope of work to accomplish the expansion entails a series of phased railroad yard configuration changes and intermodal facility construction operations.

Project Description: Subsequent to a 2002 PennDOT feasibility study and concurrent with a regional planning process resulting in the Walnut Street Corridor Redevelopment Planning Study, Susquehanna Township and Dauphin County took the lead in initiating an Intersection Design Study of the U.S. Route 22 (Walnut Street)/Progress Avenue intersection. The study acknowledged that:

1. Significant improvements need to be made to the intersection and agree that additional lanes need to be added to reduce congestion along the Corridor; and
2. An unconventional intersection solution is prudent since by their operational characteristics they are designed to handle higher volumes of traffic with less delay than conventional intersections.

In response to this effort, the project was defined with the input and approval of the Study's citizens' advisory group, and made a local and regional transportation priority. Recently, the Harrisburg Area Transportation Study (HATS) placed the project on the HATS 2030 Regional Transportation Plan. Also, Susquehanna Township and Dauphin County have both agreed on the importance of the project and have already committed funding for the project's preliminary design that has been developed by the Township Engineer.
