

Deficits in 2003 and 2004 Far Exceed Previous Record in Dollar Terms

Deficits Skyrocket with Extension of GOP Tax Cuts, AMT Reform, and Bush Defense Policies





Revenues as a Percent of GDP Lowest Level Since 1950






Government-Wide Domestic Homeland Security Spending


