
Fiscal Responsibility

- President's bipartisan fiscal commission to address long-term


Education and Energy Investments

- Funding for alternative and clean energy, energy efficiency, and green jobs


Spending as Percent of GDP Cut 11 Percent Under Budget Resolution



Deficit Cut Under Budget Resolution




Deficit as Percent of GDP Cut 70 Percent Under Budget Resolution




Economic Performance Improving

(Percent growth of real GDP in 2009, annual rate)




Jobs Picture Improving


(Monthly change, in thousands of jobs, total nonfarm payrolls, through March 2010)

 Funds the remaining Pell grant shortfall and assumes a maximum grant of \$5,550




- President's requested increases for the Department of Education and Head Start
- Extends simplified college tax credit providing up to \$2,500 a year

Budget Resolution Invests in Energy

Reduces dependence on foreign energy, creates green jobs, preserves environment, and helps with high home energy costs

- Reserve Fund to accommodate legislation to invest in clean energy and address global climate change
- \$500 million above President's level of discretionary funding for energy for FY 2011
- Builds on economic recovery package investments in renewable energy, efficiency and conservation, low carbon coal technology, and modernizing electric grid
