Obama Turns to a Little-Used Forum to Sell Health Overhaul By: Jonathan Weisman

President **Barack Obama**'s speech to a joint session of Congress on Wednesday is a rarity in post-World War II America, or all of American history, for that matter.

President **Harry Truman** was a master of the joint session speech, but since Harry stopped givin' 'em hell, there have been only 22 non-State of the Union joint addresses, and of those, 16 were either opening addresses of a presidency or on foreign policy matters, according to the office of the House historian.

John Adams was the first president to address Congress personally, in 1800, but when Woodrow Wilson addressed tariff concerns to a joint session in 1913, it had been over 100 years since a president had bothered to talk to Congress as a whole.

Truman gave non-State of the Union addresses to joint sessions nine times, on matters from the last push to end World War II to the 1952 steel industry dispute. After that, the art form went into eclipse. Domestic policy came up just six times: in 1965, when **Lyndon Johnson** spoke on voting rights; 1971, when **Richard Nixon** talked up his economic policy; 1974, when **Gerald Ford** gave an economic address; and 1977 with **Jimmy Carter** and the energy crisis.

Ronald Reagan addressed recession and inflation to a joint session in April 1981. And 16 years before Obama attempts to regain traction on health care, **Bill Clinton** went to Congress to press for his vision on a health care overhaul – a message that ultimately fell flat.
