- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Real Stimulus Act of

- 6 SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON AUTHORITY OF THE FCC.
- 7 (a) In General.—The Federal Communications
- 8 Commission shall not propose, promulgate, or issue any
- 9 regulations regarding the Internet or IP-enabled services.
