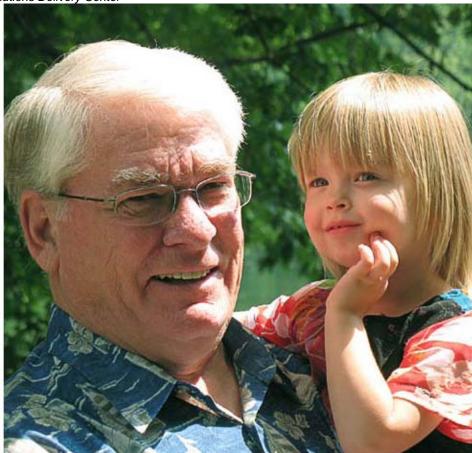

Immediate Office

The CAO Immediate Office undertook several special projects in the first six months of 2007, as outlined below. The Immediate Office includes Administrative Counsel, Communications and advisors in areas such as the *Green the Capitol Initiative*, workforce management and the Capitol Visitors Center (CVC).

Achievements and Future Plans

Green the Capitol Initiative: On March 1, 2007, Speaker Nancy Pelosi, Majority Leader Steny H. Hoyer and the late Committee on House Administration Chairwoman Juanita Millender-

McDonald directed the CAO to lead an initiative to provide an environmentally responsible and healthy working environment for employees. The preliminary *Green the Capitol Report* was accepted by House Leadership on April 19, 2007, and the final report on June 21. Over the next several months, the CAO will develop a plan for meeting the three overall goals of the initiative, working in partnership with the Architect of the Capitol:

- 1 Operate the House in a carbon-neutral manner by the end of the 110th Congress.
- 2 Reduce the carbon footprint of the House by cutting energy consumption by 50 percent in 10 years.
- 3 Make House operations a model of sustainability.

Plans are also under way for an on-campus Green Expo to be held this Fall.

House Child Care Study – The CAO began exploring options for the House of Representatives Child Care Center. ICF International was contracted to conduct a study and assessment to help the House make well

administrative specialist Andreal Little could make even the grayest day seem bright. And for the last six years, Little's been doing just that for her CAO colleagues. informed decisions that help meet the child care needs of our employees. ICF's report is due in September 2007.

House Benefits Study – The CAO has contracted Watson Wyatt Worldwide, the human capital consulting firm, to benchmark House of Representatives employee benefits against similarly sized organizations in various industries. The aim is to develop recommendations for a more robust benefits package that will not only attract talented workers but provide an incentive to stay.

House Officers' Leave Policy Enhancements – The CAO collaborated with the House Sergeant at Arms, Clerk of the House and Inspector General to develop consistent and enhanced annual leave and sick leave policies for employees of these organizations. Effective June 1, the policies increase the rate at which vacation days are earned based on years of service and remove restrictions on the amount of sick leave that may be used to care for a family member. Additionally, the definition of family has been expanded to include siblings. These policy enhancements recognize our employees' needs for a greater life/work balance.

CAO Web Site – In June 2007, the CAO launched its public-facing Web site, available at http://cao.house.gov. The new site provides an overview of the CAO organization and the *Green the Capitol Initiative*, and provides links to information and forms for potential vendors and employees.

michael keane If it's summer, it must be softball season. And for Michael Keane, that's a big deal. Keane, who has been the coach of the CAO Infomaniacs – the CAO's softball team – since 2001, always has his game face on. From determining his team's batting order to coordinating game times and locations, Keane, who usually plays shortstop, is always out to have a good time. "It's fun, we get to hang out with co-workers for a couple of hours a day. It gives us a chance to meet new people from other CAO business units." "Simplifying your day" is the goal of CAO Customer Solutions. This organization makes it as easy as possible for Members and staff to get what they need to get down to the business of serving the American people. The CAO Customer Solutions Center (CCSC)—which comprises a walk-in facility, call-in help desk and staff assigned to assist specific offices—is the first point of contact for finding answers, ordering services from throughout the CAO and exploring solutions to business problems.

Numbering 257 staff members, Customer Solutions includes the following groups:

Customer Solutions Delivery – Customer Solutions Center (includes First Call+, Office Coordinators and Graphics), House Recording Studio, Office Supply Store, House Gift Shop, Photography, Services Management and Workflow Management.

Assets, Furnishings and Logistics – Acquisition, Payments, Equipment Maintenance, Equipment Inventory Management, Logistics, Warehousing, Carpet, Drapes, Upholstery, Cabinetry, Finishing and Modular Furniture.

Immediate Office – Resource Management, Customer Relationship Management.

Achievements and Future Plans

110th Transition Office Moves/Renovations – By the start of the new Congress on January 3, the joint CAO/Architect of the Capitol transition team completed 209 Member, Committee and Leadership office moves. Among their many activities, the teams transferred 8,392 pieces of furniture, installed 12,000 yards of carpet and 369 new window treatments, and

ric galvan Ric Galvan is proud of his roots. From the toy Mini Cooper and British flag nestled proudly on his desk in the Ford building, it's easy to tell Galvan is a 'bloke' at heart. removed and reinstalled over 725 existing drapes for painters. All 259 moves were completed by January 16. Committee moves were accomplished in two phases: Phase one was completed by January 16 and phase two incorporated more detailed renovation work that included paint, carpet, furniture, room reconfigurations, and electric/telecommunication changes. Office Services is currently working on 22 office renovations and recently coordinated renovation of the Speaker's second-floor hallway.

House Equipment Fair – On February 5, the CAO hosted the House Equipment Fair, which showcased the latest trends in technology and office equipment to House staff. The overall customer satisfaction rating was 90 percent. The next fair will be held on November 13.

House Services Fair – The ninth annual House Services Fair was held on April 10. Representatives of the Architect of the Capitol, Attending Physician, Chief Administrative Officer, Clerk of the House, Library of Congress and the Sergeant at Arms staffed booths in the Cannon Caucus Room, where they provided attendees information about their services. The overall customer satisfaction rating of the event was 98 percent.

First Call+ Enhancements – First Call+ now offers customers an alternative way to request a Factiva account, a SecurID card and conversion of hard copy documents to PDF files. First Call+ can also provide information to customers wishing to set up a conference call. In an effort to continually improve its ability to effectively and efficiently provide quality solutions to customers, First Call+ has expanded its frequently asked questions database and is now using CTS2, the CAO's new customer tracking system.

CCSC Open House – On February 28, the CAO Customer Solutions Center hosted an Open House to welcome Members and staff and inform them about all the services offered by First Call+ and Office Services. CCSC representatives were on hand to answer questions regarding special

events scheduling, resume drop-off, conference call arrangements and furniture requests. With almost 200 visitors in attendance, including four new Members of Congress, the event was a success.

Food Service Improvements – Service Management implemented a number of improvements to enhance dining services. The new Fit & Trim healthy eating program features complete meals that fit within USDA recommended daily

House, he has held various positions in the furnishings and logistics departments. In his current position as **receiving and warehouse specialist**, Johann works to ensure that used or outdated House equipment and machinery, such as computer hard drives, are properly packaged and transferred to the General Services Administration for disposal and recycling. Johann says he most enjoys the camaraderie among his co-workers. "I love the easygoing atmosphere...and hanging out with the guys." Walk down the hall from Johann's office, and you may bump into his wife, Hope, who also works for the CAO as a retail product specialist in the House Office Supply Store. allowances; offerings vary throughout the week and are available at most dining facilities. In the Longworth Food Court, Members and staff only lines were added to several hot food and checkout lines in order to decrease congestion and wait times. Credit cards are now accepted at most campus food service facilities. The Capitol Market has created order slips for *Taco Salad Wednesday* to increase order accuracy and efficiency, and the Rayburn Cafeteria has enhanced the Grab 'n' Go selection to include more premium items, wraps and international tastes. The Members' Dining Room has complemented traditional menu favorites with progressive, seasonal market-driven selections to augment the dining experience.

Customer Tracking System – The CAO's new Customer Tracking System, CTS2, which provides an improved mechanism of tracking documents and managing customer requests, went live on April 10. In February 2007, it underwent user acceptance testing, with First Call+ staff, financial counselors and the office coordinators comprising the initial user group. Additional users will be transitioning to the new system through February 2008.

High Definition Digital Technology in House Recording Studio – The House Recording Studio continues to transition from analog to high definition digital technology. Upon completion in 2008, the new studio will have the capability to provide high definition video production services from the studios and the House floor.

Modular Furniture Renovation Program – The first 2007 renovation of this multi-year program was completed in April. It involved renovating the furniture of five Member offices. To date a total of 143 Member office renovations have been completed, and an additional 14 offices are scheduled through September 2007.

Office Supply Store Supports Greening Initiative – On April 23, the House Office Supply Store began selling compact fluorescent light bulbs to employees at cost. Making these bulbs available to House staff supports the *Green the Capitol Initiative*. According to the report, if all staff members installed just one compact fluorescent light bulb for their own use, it would have a

cumulative effect of removing 150 cars from the road.

lea fowlie Lea Fowlie is a go-getter. In her 33 years serving the House of Representatives, Fowlie has made her mark on Capitol Hill, taking advantage of every exciting opportunity to be involved in various activities around the Dome. Some of the interesting things she's gotten to do over the years include: testing the electronic voting system cards when they were implemented in the 1970s; attending a Joint Session of Congress and a State of the Union Address; touring the Capitol Dome; and getting to go to one of the Watergate hearings in 1974. "I'm a lot smarter and richer for the things I've seen and done," said

Fowlie. "Frankly, I can't imagine working here and not attempting to do all of these things." Fowlie serves as a **senior employee and organizational consultant** with the CAO, where her daily duties include teaching various training courses and seminars to House Members and staff.

CAO Operations comprises nearly 400 staff dedicated to maintaining and developing facilities and systems that support the business of the House of Representatives. This team also provides services and consultation to House Members and staff in the management of their individual operations and promotes the well-being of the members of the House community. The group is organized as follows:

Administrative and Financial Services – Procurement, Financial Counseling, Payroll and Benefits, Budget Management, Resource Management, Human Resources, Workplace Safety and Audit/Internal Controls.

Workforce Services – Employee and Organization Development, Employee Assistance, House Learning Center and House Child Care Center.

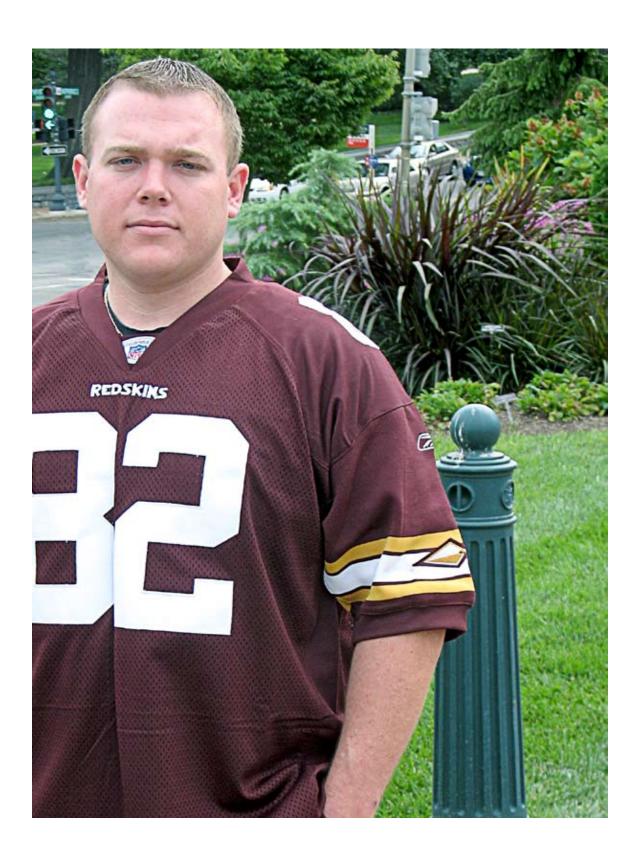
House Information Resources – Technology Support, Technology Infrastructure, Business Solutions, Web Solutions, Facilities Management, Information Security and Systems Engineering.

Immediate Office – Business Continuity and Disaster Recovery, Change Management, Business Improvement, Strategy, Measures, Portfolio Management and Committee Hearing Rooms Renovation.

Payroll and Benefits Customer Service Improvements

- The Payroll and Benefits office initiated a program aimed at improving customer service and increasing efficiency. The team's accomplishments include: cutting in half the time it takes to process payroll paperwork; introducing an online Payroll Authorization "Smart Form" to expedite the initiation

As a senior payroll and benefits generalist and team lead, Butler says the reason he loves his job is the people he works with on a daily basis. and turnaround of payroll transactions; and implementing the automatic call distribution (ACD) phone system to more quickly and efficiently assist customers. In the coming months, Payroll and Benefits employees will begin using CTS2, the new customer tracking system, which will improve the tracking of documents and management of customer requests.

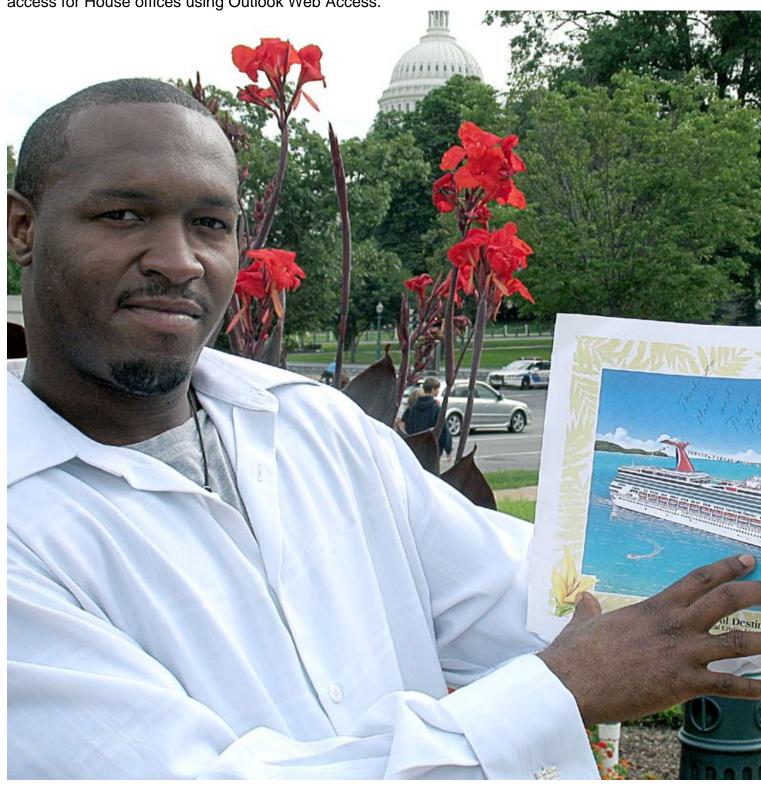
Atlas – Atlas will be the new financial and purchasing system for the House of Representatives. Through HouseNet, Atlas will provide real-time and online access to integrated budgeting, purchasing, vouchering and other related tasks. The Atlas rollout schedule was recently adjusted to allow more time to complete key tasks to ensure a successful launch. The CAO, Office of the Clerk, Office of Inspector General, Sergeant at Arms, Law Revision Counsel and Office of General Counsel are scheduled to go live in March 2008. Full system rollout to Member, Committee and Leadership offices will occur in phases starting in 2009.

In the first half of 2007, the project team completed design of the system and began to configure it based on users' requirements. CAO users were given a sneak preview of Atlas using a simulator tool to give them an idea of what to expect at go-live.

The project team has developed change management, training, communications, customer care and human resource plans to support Atlas users, CAO customers and vendors who will be affected by the implementation. Focus groups and an online survey of CAO employees provided valuable input to these plans.

HouseNet Upgrade – On June 18, 2007, a new version of the HouseNet intranet was launched to the House community. The new site features greatly improved search capabilities, streamlined navigation and a new look and feel. The home page also features a "HouseNet Shortcuts" section that contains links to the most frequently used services and Web sites.

House Messaging System: Update to Exchange 2003 – On June 18, 2007, the CAO began updating the current House Messaging System from Exchange 5.5 to Exchange 2003. Over 6,900 mailboxes have been migrated to Exchange 2003, which constitutes 33 percent of the total number of mailbox moves. Exchange 2003 provides improved Outlook performance for District offices, enhanced e-mail administration for office administrators and remote Web-based e-mail access for House offices using Outlook Web Access.

JUAN Nelson As a Maryland native, Juan Nelson feels lucky to have been raised so close to Washington, DC, and revels in the excitement of working on Capitol Hill. "Working for the House, you never know what you're going to get. We have the opportunity to meet so many different types of people," said Nelson. As a **financial solutions staff accountant**, Nelson considers himself "a jack of all trades" due to his multi-faceted day-to-day responsibilities, which include reconciling the monthly payroll and student loan files and processing cash receipts. A globe-trotter at heart, Nelson spends free time traveling with his wife and three daughters, and is looking forward to his next adventure: a week-long cruise to the Caribbean with his wife that will include stints in the Cayman Islands and Haiti.

Daylight Saving Time Upgrades – The Technology Support team proactively worked with technology vendors and developed an outreach and staff support program to ensure that all House-issued BlackBerry devices and Outlook calendars were updated to accommodate the new Daylight Saving Time, which began three weeks earlier and will end one week later this year.

Employee Self-Service – In the autumn of 2007, the Advanced Business Solutions team will begin implementing employee self-service capabilities to PayLinks, the House human resources and payroll system managed by the CAO. Self-service will offer House employees easy access to and more control over their personal information while eliminating many manual, back-office processes.

Take Your Laptop to Work Day – The CAO conducted the annual "Take Your Laptop to Work Day" for CAO employees on March 2, and for the entire House community on March 5 and 6. CAO technical specialists serviced a total of 139 machines during these three days. Their work included: securing systems against known vulnerabilities and installing software, including Microsoft updates, Trend antivirus, security patches, Daylight Saving Time updates, Adobe Reader, Quick View, etc. The average service time per machine was approximately 45 minutes.

Eldercare Assistance – In May 2007, the Workforce Services Office of Employee Assistance began exploring the cost and feasibility of providing eldercare resource and referral services to House employees. Plans include developing an employee toolkit and information resources on eldercare issues; programs such as flexible work arrangements and emergency in-home care

resources; and information briefings for House staff on eldercare and related self-care issues. This work is part of a larger initiative to improve the benefits and services available to employees to provide better work/life balance.

Partnerships-at-Work – In March 2007, Workforce Services conducted a promotional campaign to recruit students and tutors within the CAO for the Partnerships-at-Work literacy advocacy program. The CAO continues to work with the Washington Literacy Council to schedule assessments of interested students along with a training program for tutors. Currently there are three student-tutor pairs participating in the literacy component of the program. Five students are currently working toward their high school diplomas, attending twice-a-week on-site classes provided by the Academy of Hope. One student received her high school diploma in June 2007.

up the career ladder. Just two months ago, after working for 22 years in the House Radio—TV Gallery, Kornacki was named **director**, taking the spot of the Gallery's former director Tina Tate, who recently retired. "I was fortunate and lucky enough to have had the opportunity to work with Tina," said Kornacki, who's day-to-day responsibilities include directing a team of five House employees, working with journalists from almost 20 news organizations and acting as a liaison between the Congressional community and various electronic media outlets. During her colorful career, Kornacki has supported the coverage of 22 State of the Union addresses, two presidential state funerals and three lying in honors. When asked what the best part of her job is, Kornacki responded: "It's an awesome experience working for the House. I think I'm lucky to have been able to have had a front row seat to watching history."

Combined Federal Campaign – The CAO managed the promotion of the Combined Federal Campaign to the House Community, extending the campaign timeframe to early 2007 in order to include new House Members and staff. The campaign raised \$159,024 for local, national and international charitable organizations.

Awarding CAO Excellence (ACE) Ceremony – The second annual Awarding CAO Excellence (ACE) Ceremony was held April 12, 2007. Ten CAO employees were recognized in the following areas: Simplify the Day, Personalized Solutions, Dedication, Knowledge, One Team and Excellence. The Dedicated Award was renamed "The Jay Eagen Dedicated Award" and The Excellence Award was renamed "The Darrell Norman Excellence Award," in honor and recognition of their respective histories of exemplary service and contributions to the CAO organization and the House community.

Drug-Free Workplace Refresher Training Program – The CAO continues to provide mandatory drug education training for all new supervisors and employees of the House Officers regarding the specific provisions of the plan, the related drug-testing procedures and the resources available through the Office of Employee Assistance. The employee education session is conducted monthly for new hires, and the supervisory training is offered quarterly for newly promoted or hired supervisors and as a refresher for existing supervisors.

House-Wide New Employee Orientation – A New Employee Service Center was established during the first two weeks of January 2007, at the initiation of the 110th Congress, to provide new employees an easy format and process for completing their employment and payroll paperwork. The content and format for the online New Employee Orientation Program was completed through the joint effort of the CAO, our House partners and the contractor assigned to the project. The online program is expected to be deployed via HouseNet within the next three months.
