Artistic Discovery Guidelines

Sponsored by Congresswoman Judy Chu

- Artwork must be two-dimensional, should be no larger than 28"x 28"x4" (28 inches high, 28 inches wide and 4 inches deep) including the frame. Artwork cannot weigh more than 15 lbs.
- Entries cannot violate copyright law. Any entry reproduced from an existing photograph, painting or any other work by another person will NOT be accepted.
- Both teacher and student must sign the originality certification found on the Student Information Release Form.
- Artwork will hang in the Cannon Building tunnel to the U.S. Capitol building and must be suitable for all audiences. Please be mindful of this when artwork is selected.
- Artwork that will **NOT** be accepted to hang in the Cannon tunnels includes:
 - Sculpture
 - Jewelry
 - Ceramics
 - Weaving /Fabrics
 - Stained glass
 - All 3D Artwork
- Artwork categories are as follows: Paintings, drawings, collage, prints, mixed media

Artwork must be submitted into Congresswoman Chu's El Monte District Office by April 23rd, 2010 at 5:00pm.
