Clear, a TSA Registered Traveler Program, Closes its Lanes



On June 22, 2009, Verified Identity Pass, Inc. announced that it would no longer staff its Clear lanes. Clear lanes were a part of the TSA Registered Traveler Program and were staffed at twenty of the nation's airports, including Hartsfield-Jackson Airport in Atlanta and Chicago O'Hare Airport.

Clear was a TSA Registered Traveler service that allowed air travelers to get through security lines quicker. To participate in this service, a customer had to pay a fee, provide personally identifiable information (including biometric information), social security number, and a birth certificate.

Many travelers who used Clear's services are deeply concerned about the disposition and treatment of the personally identifiable information they provided to Clear. This situation is complicated because the agreement

that Clear signed with TSA, enabling the company to participate in the Registered Traveler Program, apparently failed to cover the disposition of passenger information if a participating vendor decided to terminate its involvement with the program. The Committee on Homeland Security recently wrote a letter to TSA regarding the disposition of this data and to determine TSA's role regarding the personally identifiable information of it Clear's clients.

Intended to motivate and encourage large prime contractors to build mutually beneficial developmental relationships with small businesses, this program is designed to improve performance of contracts and subcontracts, foster long-term relationships between large and small businesses, and strengthen subcontracting opportunities and accomplishments.

In order to be eligible for the program your business must meet two qualifications:

- 1) The business cannot be on the disbarred or suspended federal contractors list and
- The business must meet the definition of a small business according to the SBA's Office of Size Standards.

This program not only allows small businesses an opportunity to build relationships with established DHS contractors, but also provide an opportunity for small businesses to receive monetary, technical and other mutually agreed upon services from mentors, including government or commercial subcontracting opportunities.

BTOP/BIP Technical Assistance and Outreach Workshops

The Recovery Act provided a total of \$7.2 billion to the Commerce Department's National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) and the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Utilities Service (RUS) to accelerate broadband deployment in areas of the country that have been without the high-speed infrastructure. Of that funding, NTIA will utilize \$4.7 billion to deploy broadband infrastructure in underserved areas throughout the United States, expand public computer center capacity, and encourage sustainable adoption of broadband service. RUS will invest \$2.5 billion to facilitate broadband deployment in rural communities. (continued on p. 5)

NTIA and RUS have published the joint NOFA for the Broadband Technology Opportunity Program and the Broadband Initiatives Program (BIP), respectively. Beginning July 7, 2009, BTOP and BIP will host ten workshops around the country to assist prospective applicants. The workshops will include an overview of the grants funding available under BTOP and the grants and loans authorized BIP.

In addition, NTIA will host a pre-conference workshops, "High Speed, High Stakes: Closing the Digital Divide in Minority Communities" at three of the locations. This workshop will address the unique concerns and challenges faced by minority stakeholders, including socially and economically disadvantaged small businesses and minority serving institutions. It will also highlight the opportunities broadband deployment and adoption offer for promoting economic growth, job creation, education, health care, and public safety in minority communities.

The pre-workshop conferences are held from 2pm to 5pm the day before the workshop and will be located in the same facility. Please visit www.broadbandusa.gov for the NOFA, fact sheets, and workshop schedules and registration for remaining dates.
