Fighting for Earmark Reform

Congresswoman Giffords is fighting for earmark reform and working to curb pork-barrel spending. She wrote legislation banning lawmakers from taking campaign contributions from company executives who have requested earmarks and does not accept earmark requests from for-profit companies. She was also one of the first Members of Congress to post all earmark requests online for greater transparency and accountability.

Establishing a Bipartisan Commission to Reduce the Deficit

Congresswoman Giffords was one of the leading advocates for establishing a bipartisan debt commission with the authority to force Congress' hand in making the tough decisions necessary to end wasteful spending and put the country back on track. The commission would recommend ways to ensure the long-term solvency of Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid while reducing the debt burden for future generations. The President recently created the National Commission on Fiscal Responsibility and Reform, which will report by December 1, 2010 on ways to balance the budget and improve our long-term fiscal outlook.

Holding Irresponsible Companies Accountable

Congresswoman Giffords voted to audit the Federal Reserve to find out exactly how bailout funds were distributed. She believes that we need to hold these companies accountable. And she supported laws requiring big banks and Wall Street to pay back 100% of any taxpayer funds they received, including returning CEO bonuses.


Understanding the Federal Budget
