Dear Friends:

Every day I hear from constituents who have lost jobs, whose businesses are in trouble, or whose retirement funds have still not recovered. They all ask the same question: when is the economy going to get better?

The tough answer is that the economy is turning around, but very slowly. We've seen some good signs: consumer spending has stabilized; housing starts are rebounding; and the stock market has inched back to over 10,000 several times in the last few weeks. But unemployment is still unacceptably high – over 10% nationally and 9.3% here in Arizona.

That lingering unemployment is one of the reasons I voted to extend unemployment compensation and COBRA benefits. It's important to give Arizonans the time they need to find a job in these difficult times while protecting their access to health insurance.

The good news is that the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act that passed last February has created or saved nearly one million jobs, including 12.000 in Arizona.

I know how hard it is to see our neighbors and families struggling. As your Congresswoman, I am committed to doing everything I can to make sure that you have full access to the resources and assistance available to Arizona's families during this difficult time.

In February, Congress passed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act, which was designed to invest money in our struggling economy over the next two years and provide direct tax relief to 95% of American workers. Over \$500 million has been provided for infrastructure and job creation in Southeastern Arizona, including:

- More than \$32 million will speed deployment of advanced technology to cut energy use and make the electric-power grid more robust by a Cochise County-based utility, **Southwest Transmission Cooperative**
- Over \$80 million for projects that include improving hybrid solar electric materials, maximizing our space telescope resources, and studying agriculture and drought management, has been awarded to the University of Arizona
- \$1.7 million will be used to make repairs and improve the efficiency of low-incomeowner-occupied homes to help reduce utility bills and lower energy consumption by the **Tucson Urban League**
- \$2.2 million will be used for job training for recently dislocated workers to get them back to work in high-skilled jobs by the **Pima County One Stop** system
- \$300,000 to construct a new building at the Amado Community Food Bank that will expand operations
- More than \$27 million for our military installations, including \$13,299,000 to Davis-Monthan AFB, \$900,000 to the 162nd Air National Guard and \$13,844,000 to Fort Huachuca
- \$16,949,440 will be put to work upgrading Interstate 10 east of Tucson from Cienega Creek to Marsh Station

HEALTH CARE

On November 7th, the House passed a health insurance reform bill that I supported. Key provisions were included that many of you told me were important such as preventing insurance companies from denying care to individuals with pre-existing conditions, providing tax breaks to small businesses, and including tort reform measures.

WHAT'S NEXT?

The Senate is now working on their version of health insurance reform legislation. After it passes the Senate, a conference committee, composed of members of both the House and Senate, will negotiate one single bill that will go back to both chambers for a vote.
