Congresswoman Gabrielle Giffords Fighting to Support Our Veterans

Voted for the largest funding increase in VA history (VA Budget Authorization)

Giffords supported \$600 million more for mental health, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and Traumatic Brian Injury care than requested by the President, critical funding that would make five polytrauma centers and three Centers of Excellence for Mental Health and PTSD fully operational.



Our troops' mental and physical health is a priority for Giffords.

Strengthened Health Care for Our Troops and Military Retirees (H.R. 1585)

Giffords believes our troops' mental and physical health is a top priority. She voted to prohibit fee increases in TRICARE and its pharmacy program for service members and retirees. She also supported restoring 2,300 medical personnel and full funding for military health facility maintenance.

Supported Wounded Warrior Assistance Act (H.R. 1538)

Giffords passed an amendment that increases the reporting requirements on mental health services for returning combat veterans. H.R. 1538 also improves outpatient medical care for wounded service members at military health care facilities, and cuts bureaucratic red-tape by improving the transition of wounded service members from the Armed Forces to the VA system.

Opposed Taxes on Veterans' Families

Giffords cosponsored legislation that would put an end to the Military Families Tax, which unfairly penalizes more than 60,000 survivors, most of them widows (H.R. 1927). She supports allowing disabled veterans and their families to collect both retirement pay and disability compensation (H.R. 303, H.R. 89). Bills pending committee action.
