

**REPORT ON UNAUTHORIZED APPROPRIATIONS
AND EXPIRING AUTHORIZATIONS**

JANUARY 15, 1989

**The Congress of the United States

OVERVIEW

The Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (Public Law 99-177) requires the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) to report to the Congress on unauthorized appropriations and expiring authorizations. Section 221(b) of the Act added this requirement to Section 202(f) of the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974, as amended:

(3) On or before January 15 of each year, the Director, after consultation with the appropriate committees of the House and the Senate, shall submit to the Congress a report listing (A) all programs and activities funded during the fiscal year ending September 30 of that calendar year for which authorizations for appropriations have not been enacted for that fiscal year, and (B) all programs and activities for which no authorizations for appropriations have been enacted for the fiscal year beginning October 1 of that calendar year.

The conference report on the Balanced Budget Act states that the purpose of the requirement is "to help Congress use the early months of the year to adopt authorizing legislation that must be in place before the thirteen regular appropriation bills can be considered."

The body of this report consists of two appendixes. Appendix A summarizes unauthorized fiscal year 1989 appropriations. Appendix B lists authorizations that will expire by the end of fiscal year 1989. The listings include data on all public laws enacted during the 100th Congress. The information is contained in CBO's Legislative Classification System (LCS) and estimates of the current level of federal spending for fiscal year 1989.

PROGRAMS FUNDED IN FISCAL YEAR 1989
WITHOUT AUTHORIZATIONS OF APPROPRIATIONS

Appendix A summarizes programs and activities that have received fiscal year 1989 appropriations, but which lack authorizations of appropriations for that year.

The Congress at one time provided explicit authorizations of appropriations for the programs listed, but the authorizations expired and have not been renewed. Appendix A shows the last funding level authorized for each of these programs.

Where the appropriate fiscal year 1989 appropriations bills or the legislative history provided explicit funding levels for programs listed in Appendix A, the amounts are shown. When no explicit amounts were provided (as when a small program was funded at an unidentified level in a large appropriation account), the Appendix notes that no amounts are available, and no dollar figures are shown.

Two characteristics of the information in Appendix A should be noted. First, even if the fiscal year 1989 appropriation for a program or activity was not authorized, the agency normally may obligate and spend the funds. Second, Appendix A may not list every program and activity funded in fiscal year 1989 without an authorization, since CBO does not track expiring organic authorizations (those that do not explicitly authorize appropriations) or unauthorized earmarks in appropriation acts.

Tables 1 and 2 summarize the amounts appropriated in fiscal year 1989 for programs and activities without authorizations by House and Senate authorizing committees, respectively. Table 3 summarizes the funding levels for programs that once had explicit authorizations of appropriations, listing the amounts by public law.

Major Unauthorized Programs

Most of the \$23.1 billion in fiscal year 1989 appropriations for unauthorized programs summarized in Appendix A are in three areas. Over \$10.2 billion are for international security and development and foreign assistance programs. The 99th Congress authorized funding for those programs through fiscal year 1987. Over \$5.1 billion are for the Department of Justice. The annual authorization for most of the Department's programs has not been enacted since 1979. Nearly \$4.9 billion of the unauthorized funds are for civilian Department of Energy programs. Although annual

authorizations of appropriations for them are required by law, funding for most of these programs were last authorized, through fiscal year 1984, in the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981.

SUMMARY OF AUTHORIZATIONS OF APPROPRIATIONS EXPIRING
BETWEEN JANUARY 15, 1989 AND SEPTEMBER 30, 1989

Appendix B summarizes the authorizations of appropriations that will expire between January 15 and September 30, 1989. The listing indicates by public law the amounts authorized to be appropriated for expiring programs and activities.

Tables 4 through 7 provide aggregate information on the expiring authorizations of appropriations listed in Appendix B. Table 4 shows the number of laws that will expire before fiscal year 1990, classified by the amounts they authorize to be appropriated for fiscal year 1989. Tables 5 and 6 summarize the expiring laws by House and Senate authorizing committees, respectively. Shown for each committee are the number of expiring laws under its jurisdiction and the total authorizations for fiscal year 1989. Table 7 lists the expiring laws that authorize fiscal year 1989 appropriations greater than \$50 million.

Major Expiring Authorizations

Most of the expiring laws listed in Appendix B are annual authorizations. The largest of these include statutes that authorize fiscal year 1989 funding for the Department of Defense, the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, the U.S. Coast Guard, the Small Business Administration, various anti-drug abuse programs, the National Institute of Standards and Technology, the federal intelligence agencies, the Securities and Exchange Commission, and the Federal Communications Commission.

Also expiring before fiscal year 1990 are two-year authorizations for the Department of Housing and Urban Development and the housing programs of the Farmers Home Administration, and for the State Department. Expiring three-year authorizations include those for the special supplemental food program for women, infants, and children (WIC), the Strategic Petroleum Reserve, some education programs for the handicapped, and VISTA.
