



Dear Chairman Oberstar and Representative Schauer:

I have received Representative Schauer's letter of September 1, 2010, regarding Enbridge's apparent attempts to limit liability to Michigan residents after the rupture of Line 6B. I share your deep concern regarding the broad liability waivers and medical releases that would permit Enbridge to obtain health information on Michigan citizens.

Because my office is empowered with the authority to investigate possible violations of consumer protection laws, we have asked Enbridge to provide us with specific information regarding any liability waivers or medical releases they may have convinced Michigan residents to sign. A copy of that request for information is attached for your reference.

Although we have asked Enbridge for specific information related to the problematic waivers and releases, in the interest of efficiency, thoroughness, and speed, I would also ask that your Committee provide my office with any and all information you may have obtained from Enbridge related to this issue. It is clear from Representative Schauer's letter, and his request that this office investigate these allegations, that you share my concerns and my interest in protecting Michigan residents. Thus, it is for the benefit of Michigan residents that we ask for your assistance in this matter.

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Please provide in writing your Committee's decision to share information with my office as soon as possible, but no later than September 22, 2010, so we may take into account your Committee's response to our request when determining our next investigative course of action. If your Committee decides to share information with my office, staff from my office will discuss the transmittal of materials with appropriate Committee contacts. Thank you for your anticipated cooperation and your interest in protecting Michigan residents.

Dear Mr. Daniel:

In recent weeks, since the rupture of Line 6B near Marshall, Michigan spilled crude oil into Michigan waterways, the Michigan Attorney General's office has learned of a disturbing practice that your company may have undertaken in an effort to limit liability to Michigan residents after this spill. Specifically, the Michigan Attorney General has learned that representatives from your company have asked Michigan residents affected by the spill to sign broad liability waivers and medical releases to permit Enbridge to obtain health information on Michigan citizens. We have also received reports that representatives from your company may have convinced Michigan residents to sign waivers and releases in exchange for air purifier units to protect residents from inhaling hazardous chemicals.

Because the Michigan Attorney General is empowered with the authority to investigate possible violations of consumer protection laws, when we learn of disturbing allegations such as the ones outlined above, inquiry is made to determine if such laws have been violated. As such, the Attorney General is requesting that you provide information regarding any liability waivers or medical releases that your company asked Michigan residents to sign. Such information includes, but is not limited to, the following:

1. Sample copies of all liability waivers, medical release forms, contracts, and all documents provided to Michigan residents related to the rupture of Line 6b and the resulting spill of crude oil into Michigan waterways;
2. Copies of any liability waivers, contracts, or any other documents that have been executed or signed by Michigan residents and returned to Enbridge, or any third parties working on behalf of Enbridge, related to the rupture of Line 6B and the resulting spill of

crude oil into Michigan waterways. Please note that although we are not requesting copies of completed medical release forms in Enbridge's possession or control at this time, we reserve the right to request these in the future;

3. A list of all Michigan residents who may have received documents or contracts, including liability waivers, and forms permitting the release of medical information, from Enbridge or any third parties working on behalf of Enbridge, related to the rupture of Line 6B. Include information regarding whether the Michigan resident returned the documents, if so, which documents have been returned, and if any documents provided have yet to be executed and returned to Enbridge, or any third parties working on behalf of Enbridge. This list should include names of Michigan residents receiving the documents or information described above, addresses for these residents, and any additional contact information Enbridge has in their possession or control;
4. Copies of all policies used by Enbridge, or third parties working on behalf of Enbridge, to safeguard personal identifying information, including, but not limited to Social Security Numbers, bank account or other financial account information, and information contained in medical records;
5. Any training materials, scripts, or other oral or written instructions provided to Enbridge employees, or third parties working on behalf of Enbridge, regarding their interaction with Michigan residents affected by the rupture of Line 6B; and
6. Documents and information provided to Congress in response to any Congressional inquiry regarding the interaction between Enbridge, or any third parties working on behalf of Enbridge, and Michigan residents affected by the rupture of Line 6B. The Congressional inquiry may pertain, but is not limited in scope to, any documents, contracts, liability waivers, or forms permitting the release of medical information to Enbridge or any third parties working on behalf of Enbridge, and instructions given to Enbridge employees or third parties working on behalf of Enbridge.
