<p><u>Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2008 (H.R. 2642)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Establishes temporary Emergency Compensation (EUC) program providing up to 13 weeks of Federal benefits. Programs in place through March 31, 2009, subsequently extended and built upon. 	<p><u>Unemployment Compensation Extension Act of 2008 (H.R. 6867)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Increases EUC's basic tier to up to 20 weeks of benefits. Establishes second tier of EUC benefits in high unemployment States (those with a 13-week <u>Insured Unemployment Rate</u> (IUR) ≥ 4% or <u>Total Unemployment Rate</u> (TUR) ≥ 6%). Temporarily funds first week of permanent Extended Benefits (EB) program for all States, not just those with waiting weeks. Programs in place through March 31, 2009, subsequently extended and built upon by H.R. 1, H.R. 3548 and H.R. 3326. 	<p><u>American Recovery & Reinvestment Act of 2009 (H.R. 1)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Establishes Federal Additional Compensation (FAC) program to increase all weekly UI benefits by \$25. Temporarily provides 100% Federal funding of EB program, which provides up to 13-20 weeks of additional benefits depending on State law and labor market. Provides States with additional administrative funding and \$7 billion in incentive payments to expand access to unemployment insurance. Waives State interest payments on short-term loans from Federal government for unemployment insurance benefits. Extends EUC and keeps new programs in place through December 31, 2009, subsequently extended by H.R. 3326. 	<p><u>Worker, Homeownership, and Business Assistance Act of 2009 (H.R. 3548)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Increases Tier II EUC to 14 weeks and makes it available in all States Establishes Tier III of EUC benefits in States with a 13-week IUR ≥ 4% or TUR ≥ 6%. Establishes Tier IV of EUC benefits in States with a 13-week IUR ≥ 6% or TUR ≥ 8.5%. Programs in place through December 31, 2009, subsequently extended by H.R. 3326. 	<p><u>Dept. of Defense Appropriations Act, 2010 (H.R. 3326)</u></p> <p>Thru Feb. 28, 2010:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Extends Federal unemployment programs (including EUC, EB and FAC). 	<p><u>Temporary Extension Act of 2010 (H.R. 4691)</u></p> <p>Thru April 5, 2010:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Extends Federal unemployment programs (including EUC, EB and FAC). 	<p><u>Continuing Extension Act of 2010 (H.R. 4851)</u></p> <p>Thru June 2, 2010:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Extends Federal unemployment programs (including EUC, EB and FAC). 	<p><u>Unemployment Compensation Extension Act (H.R. 4213)</u></p> <p>Thru Nov. 30, 2010:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Extends Federal unemployment programs (including EUC and EB).
