The resolution contains provisions to modify the current laws that prohibit the sale of certain videos or other items that depict animal cruelty. If those provisions are enacted, the government could pursue cases that it otherwise would not be able to prosecute. Because those prosecuted and convicted under the resolution could be subject to criminal fines, the federal government might collect additional amounts if the resolution is enacted. Criminal fines are recorded as revenues, deposited in the Crime Victims Fund, and later spent. CBO estimates that any additional revenues and direct spending would not be significant because of the small number of cases likely to be affected.
