Note:

H.R. 6156 would renew Section 1130 of the Social Security Act for the 2011-2016 period. Section 1130 allows for demonstration projects related to child welfare to be operated by the states. Those projects are required to be cost-neutral, and the Department of Health and Human Services has mechanisms in place to ensure that this requirement is met. As such, there would be no costs associated with the renewal of Section 1130.

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
