Miami Beach Community Health Center (MBCHC) has provided primary health care to all residents of Miami Beach and Miami-Dade County for over 30 years, especially those who are medically indigent and/or uninsured. Because of the earthquake in Haiti, and the resulting influx of Haitian patients, the Center is quickly reaching capacity and facing massive costs.

There will be an incubator that will house various programs such as the technical assistance, technology development, training and recruiting and economic activities. The targeted population is small minority owned businesses.

Officer Tactical Facility Enhancements 11380 NW 27th Ave., Miami, FL 33167 \$3,000,000

This all-inclusive, one-stop Officer Tactical Training Facility would provide a seamless approach for local and state law enforcement professionals to receive academic as well as tactical training to enhance the performance of their duties and responsibilities in an ever-changing, demanding environment. The facility will be used by State, County, and Federal police and corrections agencies, as well as military agencies in South Florida. Currently over 1,000 officers from 30+ municipal and school system Police Departments and 2 Corrections Systems (FL State and Miami Dade County) train at Miami Dade College's North Campus.

Mortgage Fraud Task Force 9105 NW 25th Street, Doral, FL 33172 \$2,000,000

The funding for this project would be used for the creation of a Mortgage Fraud Task Force National Model to train law enforcement individuals in those identified communities which represent the ten (10) highest concentrated areas affected by mortgage fraud. The anticipated benefits include a more effective process of dealing with and prosecuting mortgage fraud in Miami-Dade County and nationwide, and eventually, a decrease in the occurrence of mortgage fraud.
