	<p>McKean County has benefitted significantly from the Recovery Act. As a direct result, over 18,000 constituents received a tax cut. In addition, McKean County has received over \$19 million in funding for education, transportation, and infrastructure and other projects.</p>

Education	<p>The Recovery Act is providing much-needed federal funding for local school districts. School districts are using these funds for a variety of purposes, including special education, educational technology, and basic education needs. These funds have unequivocally prevented the elimination of teaching positions and have helped stabilize education budgets throughout the Commonwealth. Specific awards in McKean County include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ \$2,589,197 to the Bradford Area School District ➤ \$1,362,686 to the Kane Area School District ➤ \$975,160 to the Otto-Eldred School District ➤ \$1,262,574 to the Port Allegany School District ➤ \$1,007,012 to the Smethport Area School District

Transportation and Infrastructure	<p>The Recovery Act is helping Pennsylvania revitalize its transportation infrastructure through highway resurfacing and bridge rehabilitation projects. It is also providing funding for key infrastructure projects designed to improve water quality. Specific awards in McKean County include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ \$749,622 to the Janders Run Bridge Replacement ➤ \$2,947,526 for Rehabilitation of US Route 219 including roadway, drainage, and guiderail improvements from Lewis Run to Custer City ➤ \$4,220,449 for Group 2-09-R04. Bridge Preservation of 7 bridges in various locations in Cameron, Clearfield, McKean and Potter Counties ➤ \$845,491 for Norwich Twp - Wastewater Collection and Treatment Project
