WARREN COUNTY



Warren County has benefitted significantly from the Recovery Act. As a direct result, over 17,000 constituents received a tax cut. In addition, Warren County has received over \$14 million in funding for education, transportation, and infrastructure and other projects.

Education

The Recovery Act is providing much-needed federal funding for local school districts. School districts are using these funds for a variety of purposes, including special education, educational technology, and basic education needs. These funds have unequivocally prevented the elimination of teaching positions and have helped stabilize education budgets throughout the Commonwealth. Specific awards in Warren County include:

- > \$4,892,679 to the Warren County School District
- ➤ \$120,362 to the Tidioute Community Charter School

Total Education Funding: \$5,013,041

Transportation and Infrastructure

The Recovery Act is helping Pennsylvania revitalize its transportation infrastructure through highway resurfacing and bridge rehabilitation projects. It is also providing funding for key infrastructure projects designed to improve water quality. Specific awards in Warren County include:

- ➤ \$1,523,687 for bridge replacement on US Route 6
- ➤ \$566,393 for the resurfacing of State Route 3005
- ➤ \$432,006 for slide correction work on the Warren Bypass US 6

Total T&I Funding: \$2,522,086

Helping Children and Families

The Recovery Act is helping those hit hardest by the economic downturn. Here is how Warren County residents are benefiting:

- ➤ 17,867 residents of Warren County have enjoyed federal tax relief as a result of the Recovery Act
- ➤ 2,200 jobless adults will receive a boost in unemployment compensation
- ➤ 1,800 unemployed persons qualify for more help purchasing health insurance
- > 7,109 low income children and adults will continue to have access to health care through Medical Assistance
