

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 5136, AS REPORTED  
OFFERED BY MS. SCHAKOWSKY OF ILLINOIS**

At the end of subtitle B of title XII, add the following new section:

**1 SEC. 12xx. RECOMMENDATIONS ON OVERSIGHT OF CON-**  
**2 TRACTORS ENGAGED IN ACTIVITIES RELAT-**  
**3 ING TO AFGHANISTAN.**

**4 (a) RECOMMENDATIONS REQUIRED.**—Not later than  
**5 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the**  
**6 Special Inspector General for Afghanistan Reconstruction**  
**7 shall, in consultation with the Inspector General of the De-**  
**8 partment of Defense, the Inspector General of the United**  
**9 States Agency for International Development, and the In-**  
**10 spector General of the Department of State—**

**11 (1) issue recommendations on measures to in-**  
**12 crease oversight of contractors engaged in activities**  
**13 relating to Afghanistan that have a record of engag-**  
**14 ing in waste, fraud, or abuse;**

**15 (2) report on the status of efforts of the De-**  
**16 partment of Defense, the United States Agency for**  
**17 International Development, and the Department of**  
**18 State to implement existing recommendations re-**  
**19 garding oversight of such contractors; and**

1 (3) report on the extent to which military and  
2 security contractors or subcontractors engaged in ac-  
3 tivities relating to Afghanistan have been responsible  
4 for the deaths of Afghan civilians.

5 (b) ELEMENTS OF RECOMMENDATIONS.—The rec-  
6 ommendations issued under subsection (a)(1) shall in-  
7 clude—

8 (1) recommendations for reducing the reliance  
9 of the United States on—

10 (A) military and security contractors or  
11 subcontractors engaged in activities relating to  
12 Afghanistan that have been responsible respon-  
13 sible for the deaths of Afghan civilians; and

14 (B) Afghan militias or other armed groups  
15 that are not part of the Afghan National Secu-  
16 rity Forces; and

17 (2) recommendations for prohibiting the De-  
18 partment of Defense, the Department of State, or  
19 the United States Agency for International Develop-  
20 ment from entering into contracts with contractors  
21 engaged in activities relating to Afghanistan that  
22 have a record of engaging in waste, fraud, or abuse.
