





Disaster Response Summary GA Floods Disaster Summary Report September 23, 2009 – 11:00 A.M. (EDT)

OPERATIONS

As rising flood waters cover the Southeast, hundreds have looked to the American Red Cross for shelter as officials estimate the number of people needing help could rise dramatically. As of midnight last night, there were more than 350 individuals registered in seven Red Cross shelters in Georgia. The American Red Cross is providing a safe place to stay, food to eat, and a shoulder to lean on for those affected by the flooding.

The Red Cross is working closely with local, state and federal emergency management to determine the needs of those affected by the flood and will continue to assess the need for emergency sheltering/lodging in the coming days.
