

Legislative Highlights

Below you will find highlights of key legislation passed during the 1st quarter of the 110th Congress. Through roles as House Leadership, Committee/Subcommittee Chairmanships and strength in numbers, CBC Members have been able to influence not only passage but content and language of legislation. On all of these votes, at least 35 of the 40 voting Members of the CBC voted for passage.

Legislation	We Are Impacting America's Families
Minimum Wage	• Increases the federal minimum wage to \$7.25 an hour over the next two years. Nearly 13 million American's will benefit;
Stem Cell Research	Provides federal funding for stem cell research which has the potential to treat and possibly cure Sickle Cell Anemia, Diabetes, Paralysis, Multiple Sclerosis, Alzheimer's and Parkinson's diseases;
Student Loans	Boosts college financial aid by \$18 billion over the next five years, while reducing the federal deficit by nearly \$1 billion; increases the purchasing power of the Pell Grant by \$500 over the next five years to \$5,200 by 2011;
Disadvantaged Business Disaster Eligibility Act	Provides disaster relief assistance to small businesses participating in the 8(a) business development program in areas affected by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. Extends eligibility for such assistance for an additional 18 months;
Katrina Housing Tax Relief Act of 2007	Extends Low Income Housing Tax Credits until 2010; enhances & extends Section 143 mortgage revenue bond provisions; requires a GAO study of practices employed by state and local governments in allocating and utilizing tax incentives;
United States Troop Readiness, Veterans' Health and Iraq Accountability Act, 2007	 Provides \$4.3 billion for FEMA disaster recovery grants and waivers; \$260 million for agriculture and fisheries disaster assistance; \$1.3 billion for east and west bank levee protection and costal restoration; \$30 million for K-12 education assistance; extension of FEMA utility subsidy program and community Disaster Loan forgiveness; provide \$6.4 billion to Hurricane Katrina and Rita impacted areas;
Gulf Coast Hurricane Housing Recovery Act of 2007	Provides increased funding to assist displaced renters and public housing residents; provides flexibility for \$1.2 billion in Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) funds to meet housing needs in Louisiana;
Hurricane Katrina and Rita Federal Match Relief Act of 2007	Provides Community Disaster Loan forgiveness, \$4.3 billion for FEMA disaster recovery grants and waives the Stafford Act state matching requirements;
Accountability in Contracting Act	 Makes several changes to federal acquisition laws to increase transparency and accountability in federal contracting, to require agencies to limit the use of certain types of abuse-prone contracts, and to promote integrity in the acquisition workforce;
Supplemental II	Provides extension of FEMA utility subsidy program for government employees affected by Hurricane Katrina and Rita; pays for the utility bills of those essential government employees still working and living in temporary FEMA trailers;
Hate Crimes Act	Provides legal protection for churches, synagogues, and mosques against hate crimes; establishes funds to local police departments to prosecute hate crimes; protects the First Amendment so that speeches and sermons are not included as hate crimes; includes hate crimes based on disability, gender or sexual orientation;
The Farm, Nutrition and Bioenergy Act of 2007	• Allows Black farmer claimants in <i>Pigford</i> an opportunity to have their cases on civil rights abuses heard; establishes mandatory funding for Socially Disadvantaged Farmers and Ranchers Outreach Program; increases research opportunities for 1890 Land Grant institutions, raises the standard deduction and minimum benefit for Food Stamps for the first time in over 20 years, bringing them to a TRUE cost of living; lists the \$175 dependant child care cap in Food Stamps, allowing families to deduct ALL of their child expenses;
The Children's Health Insurance and Medicare Protection Act (CHAMP) of 2007	Increased health insurance coverage, including dental and mental health care for up to 11.8 million low-income children; enriches coverage for End Stage Renal Disease; reduces health care co-payments for senior citizens.
Improving Head Start Act of 2007	Expands and improves Head Start funding, proving funding for an additional 10,000 children, with priority on expanding Early Head Start.
Darfur Accountability and Divestment Act	Allows state and local governments to adopt divestment measures involving federally identified persons with investments and business in the Sudanese energy and military equipment sectors or persons having direct investment in or carrying trade or business with Sudan or the Government of Sudan.
The Emmett Till Unsolved Civil Rights Crime Act	Establishes an Unsolved Crimes Section in the Department of Justice and an Unsolved Civil Rights Crime Investigation office in the FBI to investigate violations of criminal rights statutes that occurred before January 1970 and resulted in death.
