

MILITARY ACADEMY NOMINATIONS. To receive an appointment to a military academy you must have a congressional nomination from your home-state Senator or from the Representative for the district where you reside. To apply for a nomination, you must submit a written request for nomination and complete a nomination application form by November 1 of your senior year in high school. The selection process is non-partisan and based on merit.



FLAG REQUESTS U.S. flags can be flown over the Capitol to commemorate a special occasion or to honor someone. To ensure timely receipt, you should place your order one month in advance.

South Florida **2004 ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

By working in Congress to advance our shared priorities for the 21st District, I was proud have successfully secured federal funding for South Florida's needs. This funding allows us to make a sound investment in important projects that serve the diverse needs of communities throughout the District. Below are some of those key projects.

South Florida is an educational hub—We must strive to offer preeminent educational opportunities at all levels.

- At my request, \$2 million was dedicated to support the University of Miami Lehman Injury Research Center and Ryder Trauma Center—funding that will address the health care needs of our area, while also assisting the men and women of our military.
- An additional \$1.7 million was obtained to help support programs at important community based institutions in education throughout the district, assisting our regional universities.
- I also proudly joined the bi-partisan effort to pass the Child Nutrition Improvement and Integrity Act. This legislation was designed to ensure that America's most vulnerable children receive the assistance they need by investing billions of dollars in child nutrition and related programs in communities nationwide.

Miami-Dade and Broward Counties continue to grow at a rapid pace. While growth can bring benefits to a region, it also places strains on local services.

 Last year, I worked to ease congestion on area roads and helped provide for the continuity of water services in the 21st District.

• \$5.4 million in federal funding was secured to help expand and improve local highways and transit service and to support the expansion of a water treatment facility.

Providing employment opportunities and expanding economic prosperity throughout our region is a top priority.

- In 2004, tens of thousands of jobs were created throughout Miami-Dade and Broward counties.
- I was proud to help pass the American Jobs Creation Act of 2004 which helped keep the economy growing and provided job opportunities for those seeking employment throughout our area.

One of the most important tasks facing our nation is to make our country safe from terrorist attacks.

- In the wake of the 9/11 attacks, the Homeland Security Committee was established to help coordinate the resources dedicated to protecting our nation from a terrorist attack and, in part, to oversee the Department of Homeland Security. As the Chairman of the Homeland Security Committee's Subcommittee on Rules, I was responsible for providing the legislative framework for making the Homeland Security Committee a permanent reality, providing guidance and leadership to the new, important department.
- Making certain our local emergency personnel have the resources needed, in addition to providing funding for increased security costs at our air and sea ports, is a shared responsibility for all levels of government. South Florida has benefited from a wide array of homeland security funding for local first responders and related operations at our local air and sea ports.

Looking Forward 2005 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

We have achieved great progress on behalf of the people of the South Florida—but there is still much to be done. I look forward to working on your behalf on an aggressive legislative agenda to protect America and assist our community.

Protecting America

• Under the leadership of President Bush, our nation has made great strides toward protecting all Americans from terrorist attacks. Just this month, I helped secure \$20 million in federal funding for Miami International Airport's explosive detection system. This system is used by MIA to facilitate the screening of checked bags and for the screening bulk-break cargo. It is vital that the lines of communication remain open among local, state and federal officials regarding potential threats and that emergency personnel have access to the resources necessary to prevent and respond to crises. I will continue to work to strengthen the security of our nation and local community.
