Congressman Broun's office is pleased to offer internships to students who wish to learn more about Congress and the legislative process. By allowing students a unique perspective on the inner workings of our country's democratic government, Congressional internships offer an exciting educational experience.

Internships with Congressman Broun are unpaid positions. During the summer months, internships generally last for a minimum of five to six weeks. During the academic year (September to May), internships generally cover the student's semester, from September to December in the fall or January to May in the spring. Both part-time and full-time internships are available.

Interns in our office must be highly motivated, have strong communication skills—both written and verbal—and keen interest in the legislative process. Duties could include attending legislative hearings and community meetings, participating in regular office meetings, conducting legislative research, guiding tours of the Capitol Building, and responding to constituent inquiries and phone calls.

Internships offered in the 10th Congressional District allow students to work directly with Georgians who are experiencing problems with federal agencies. Caseworkers act as liaisons between constituents and government agencies, working to resolve individual constituent problem. Interns will have the opportunity to assist our staff in working with federal agencies, such as the Social Security Administration, Veterans Administration and Internal Revenue Service. Additionally, they will assist with administrative duties, including filing, answering telephone calls, and maintaining office appearance. Students with excellent communication skills, both verbal and written, as well as strong problem solving skills are encouraged to apply.
