**Removal of BOP and Capping Stack** – The Capping Stack and failed BOP have been successfully removed from the Macondo wellhead. The BOP and Lower Marine Riser Package were shipped to a NASA facility at Michoud, LA, where investigation teams will follow agreed upon disassembly protocols. The Capping Stack is onboard the vessel *Enterprise* and awaiting instructions from the Incident Commander about protocols for disassembly.

BP is complying with government directives concerning all recovery of equipment from the Macondo well. We are following Admiral Allen's instructions on bringing equipment to the surface. The U.S. Government will then preserve the equipment at a facility in New Orleans specified by the Marine Board of Investigation. Additionally, we are responding to a request from the Department of the Interior that BP and other parties provide input into the types of inspection, testing and analysis that government agencies or others might conduct on the BOP.

**Relief Wells** – Following discussions with Unified Command and federal scientists and engineers, a lock-down sleeve was installed over the weekend, which in combination with the new BOP resulted in the necessary conditions to commence the finalization of the relief well. The lock-down sleeve is a mechanical device that completely secures the casing hangar and the annulus. The new BOP and lock-down sleeve on the Macondo wellhead provide a robust system to contain any pressure put into the Macondo well during intercept and a bottom kill operation. On Monday at 1:40 pm CDT, the *Development Driller III* re-started drilling in the first relief well. The *DDIII* will drill to 17,939 feet, and then run the ranging tool, which helps determine the accurate location of the Macondo wellbore. The relief well is approximately 50 vertical feet from the intercept point and once the intercept is reached, BP can proceed with the bottom kill operation – the last step in completely plugging the well.

**SHORELINE:** Beach cleanups continued in Hancock, Harrison and Jackson counties. Vessel decontamination ongoing at multiple sites. Vessels of opportunity conducting submerged oil assessments.  
**BOOM:** Final boom recovery has been completed in Mississippi.

**ALABAMA**

**SHORELINE:** Beach cleanups to continue in Gulf Shores and West Dauphin Island. Vessel decontamination ongoing.  
**BOOM:** Final boom recovery has been completed in Alabama.

**FLORIDA**

**SHORELINE:** Beach cleanups to continue in Escambia, Santa Rosa, Okaloosa and Walton counties.  
**BOOM:** Final boom recovery has been completed in Florida.
