7	(3) recognizes that much of this progress is due
8	to the skill, persistence, and valor of the American
9	soldier;

1	(4) recognizes that the decision by the Presi-
2	dent and our military leadership to provide a surge
3	of troops to implement a new counterinsurgency
4	strategy was the correct course of action and has
5	been successful; and
6	(5) hopes for, and will do all it can to help en-
7	sure, coalition victory there as soon as possible.
